6. (a) Animals, that do not kick, are always unexcitable.
(b) Donkeys have no horns.
(c) A buffalo can always toss one over a gate.
(d) No animals that kick are easy to swallow.
(e) No hornless animal can toss one over a gate.
(f) All animals are excitable, except buffaloes.
