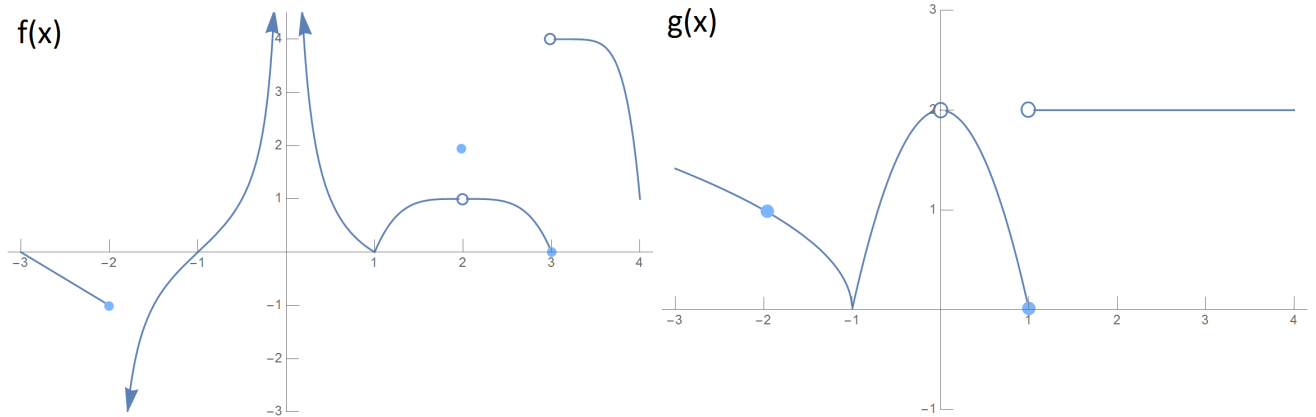

1. (12 points) Throughout this problem, use the graphs of f and g below:



(a) [2 pts] Find $\lim_{x \rightarrow 0} f(x)$.

(b) [2 pts] Find $\lim_{x \rightarrow 2} f(x)$.

(c) [2 pts] Find $\lim_{x \rightarrow -2^-} f(x)$.

(d) [2 pts] Find $\lim_{x \rightarrow 1} (f(x) + g(x))$.

(e) [2 pts] Find $\lim_{x \rightarrow -1} f(x)g(x)$.

(f) [2 pts] Find $\lim_{x \rightarrow 2} \frac{f(x)}{g(x)}$.

2. (12 points) Use the functions

$$f(x) = \frac{x^2 - 16}{x - 4} \quad g(x) = \begin{cases} x^2 - 3 & x < -2 \\ x^3 + 9 & -1 > x \geq -2 \\ x + 2 & x \geq -1 \end{cases} \quad h(x) = \frac{1}{x - 2}$$

to find the stated limits.

(a) $\lim_{x \rightarrow 4} f(x)$

(b) $\lim_{x \rightarrow -1} f(x)$

(c) $\lim_{x \rightarrow -4} g(x)$

(d) $\lim_{x \rightarrow -2} g(x)$

(e) $\lim_{x \rightarrow -1^+} g(x)$

(f) $\lim_{x \rightarrow -1^-} g(x)$

(g) $\lim_{x \rightarrow 2^+} h(x)$

(h) $\lim_{x \rightarrow 2^-} h(x)$

3. (12 points) Throughout this problem, let $f(x) = x^2 + 3x^{-2} - 4$.

(a) [4 pts] Find the slope of tangent line of f at $x = 3$.

(b) [4 pts] Find the tangent line of f at $x = 3$.

(c) [4 pts] Find the instantaneous rate of change of f at $x = 1$.

4. **(12 points)** In the following problem, you may draw graphs to support your answer but they should not be your only source of justification.

(a) [4 pts] Determine whether $h(x) = \begin{cases} x^3 - 5 & x < 0 \\ 5 \cos(x) & x \geq 0 \end{cases}$ is continuous at $x = 1$.

(b) [4 pts] Determine whether $s(x) = \begin{cases} \frac{1}{x-2} & x < 2 \\ x-2x & 2 \leq x \end{cases}$ is continuous at $x = 2$.

(c) [4 pts] For what values of x is $r(x) = \frac{x^2 + 3x - 10}{x^2 - x - 2}$ continuous? Explain your conclusion in 1-2 sentences.

5. (12 points)

(a) [? pts] Consider $h(x) = x^2 - 1$ over the interval $[0, 1]$. Write a value y such that there must exist a c between 0 and 1 such that $h(c) = y$.

(b) [? pts] Show that $f(x) = x^3 + 4x^2 - 3$ has a zero between 0 and 2.

(c) [? pts] Find an interval $[a, b]$ on which $g(x) = \cos(x) - \sin(x)$ must have a zero.

(d) [? pts] Consider $g(x) = \begin{cases} 3x + 4 & x < 2 \\ 2x - 1 & x \geq 2 \end{cases}$. On which of the following intervals (if any) does the Intermediate Value Theorem apply?

I. $(-\infty, \infty)$ _____

II. $[4, 20]$ _____

III. $[-3, 0)$ _____

IV. $(-10, 10]$ _____

6. (12 points) (*Discontinuities.*)

(a) [4 pts] List the discontinuities of $f(x) = \begin{cases} \frac{x^2 - 2x - 8}{x + 2} & x \leq 0 \\ \frac{-12}{x} & x > 0 \end{cases}$. For each one, determine the type of discontinuity.

(b) [4 pts] What does it mean to say that a discontinuity is a “jump” discontinuity? You may give an intuitive description but also include a precise definition.

(c) [4 pts] Create a function with a removable discontinuity at $x = 3$.

7. (12 points) (*Derivative Definition*)

(a) [? pts] State one of the limit definitions for the derivative of $f(x)$.

(b) [? pts] Compute $f'(3)$ for $f(x) = x + 4$ using the limit definition of the derivative.

(c) [? pts] Compute the derivative of each of the following using the limit definition of the derivative:

- $f(x) = \sqrt{x+1}$

- $g(x) = \frac{1}{x-1}$

- $h(x) = \frac{x^2-1}{x+1}$

8. (12 pts) (*Sequences*)

(a) [? pts] Write the formula for a bounded sequence.

(b) [? pts] Write a formula for an unbounded sequence.

(c) [? pts] Write a formula for a sequence that doesn't converge.

(d) [? pts] Prove that $\{1 + \frac{1}{n}\}_{n=1}^{\infty}$ converges to 1.

(e) [? pts] Prove that $\left\{\frac{n^2 - 2}{3n^2 + 3}\right\}_{n=1}^{\infty}$ converges to $\frac{1}{3}$.

9. (12 points) Compute the derivatives for each of the following by any means:

(a) [3 pts] $4^2 - 3x + x^3$

(b) [3 pts] $\frac{x^2 + 4x + 5}{\sqrt{x}}$ (This is kind of a trick)

(c) [3 pts] $\frac{2}{x^2} - 2x^2 + \pi x^\pi$

(d) [3 pts] $x^e + e^x - 17$

10. **(12 points)** *True or False.* If the statement is true, explain why. If the answer is false, explain why or give an example that disproves the statement.

(a) **[3 pts]** If a function f is differentiable at a then f is continuous at a .

(b) **[3 pts]** A function g has a vertical asymptote at $x = a$ if $g'(a) = 0$.

(c) **[3 pts]** For *any* function h , $\lim_{x \rightarrow a} h(x) = h(a)$.

(d) **[3 pts]** The function $s(x) = \cos(2x^3 - 5) + e^{7x} - 9$ is continuous on \mathbb{R} .
