Preliminary Homework Assigned Friday, January 24

Note: Preliminary homework is always graded credit or no credit. You get full credit for completing the assignment, whether or not your answers are correct, as long as your work shows you have thought about the problem. The purpose of preliminary homework is to start you thinking about the topic of the next class.

You may use your preliminary homework for in-class activities with your classmates. You should be sure to think about these questions so you will be prepared.

Preliminary homework is always due at the beginning of the next class.

Make an outline of the material we have covered during the first three weeks of the course. Include anything that will help you study for the exam: Definitions, theorems, examples, techniques, kinds of problems you can solve, key facts.

Do not automatically structure your outline according to the course syllabus. Think about what structure makes most sense to you. For example, you might want one heading for techniques of integration, and one heading for applications of integration.

Since this outline may help you study for the exam, it would be a good idea to hand in one copy and keep one copy.
